## **Educational Update**

Over the past year we have been working hard to improve the quality of the activities and excursions that we offer. Our focus is on the educational and enjoyment elements of what we provide as we aim to give your pupils the best possible experience. As part of this work we do now have a few new activities and excursions to offer you.

Highly recommended is a day trip to the beautiful town of Beaune. This includes a visit to the famous *Musée de l'Hôtel-Dieu de Beaune* as well as a tour and tasting at *La Moutarderie* of the Fallot family who have been producing Dijon mustard using traditional methods since 1840.

We are also fortunate to be able to offer you access to a new educational centre, opened by the French government last year at Alésia, the site of the final battle between the Gauls and the Romans. A tour of the site and museum as well as a demonstration of Gaul and Roman fighting techniques is a good half day excursion or with the addition of a visit to the remains of a nearby Gallo-Roman town can be extended to a whole day activity.

Another new activity which has proved popular is the introduction of handball at the centre since our expert Amélie joined the team. We are hoping we may inspire the next generation of GB handball players following success at the recent Olympics ....

We have also spent some time as a team together developing the quality of the whole educational package that we provide. We have looked at teaching techniques as well as content, with a focus on developing themes that run throughout the week. We hope that you will see this reflected in the week you experience with us.
