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A Busy Winter of Building Works

Well it seems like no time at all since we last wrote a newsletter to keep everyone up to date with events in the normally quiet hammeau of Méluzien. We have definitely been the source of some interest to our neighbours in the last few months as we worked solidly over the winter to make the changes we felt were needed to the buildings and facilities. The sight of us running around from job to job seemed to be a source of great entertainment to everyone locally but at the same time the encouragement we also got for what we were doing was very rewarding.

Maison Claire Fontaine is at the heart of a very small community and we have never felt more aware of that than when discussing the refurbishment of the windows with the man who made the original ones in the 1950s who was walking his dog past us one day.



We have spent lots of time on the simpler and frankly unglamorous things that needed

sorting out in the building such as getting all the toilets to work properly, all the old leaking taps replaced and the guttering replaced or repaired around the roof. Mark has discovered that he definitely didn't come to France to be a plumber but thankfully we have enjoyed the help of a great local man who has been fantastic at getting things flowing as they should.

Perhaps of more interest to everyone is the news that we have replaced all of the mattresses on all the bunk beds and put some new beds in the teachers rooms (including a double bed in the annexe). On the subject of teachers' accommodation we have also added a brand new double teachers room in the dormitory at the far end of the first floor by the fire escape door.



Although without a sink at the moment, this room is certainly a good addition to our facilities and makes for far better security and more even supervision of the upstairs dormitories.

Outside in the grounds we continued our work with the installation of a raised bed by the outside eating area to introduce some colour and scent into that part of the garden.

We are also planning a bit more colour this year with some hanging baskets of flowers to brighten up the site. Perhaps most importantly we have installed a new fence along the top of the wall running by the river where the bus parks and the table football is located.

On the educational side of things we have also been very busy upgrading the classroom facilities with new display boards and blackboards and working to enhance the teaching resources that we have at our disposal. The feedback on our lessons and activities is that we are making improvements in our effectiveness which is enhancing both the enjoyment and educational value of the trips to us. We will continue to do far more on the educational side of our work and as we get to know each school better we will be increasingly focussed on trying to exactly meet the individual emphasis and objectives that you have for your trip to us.

Coach Travel

We were naturally very sorry to hear of the two significant coach crashes involving school trips earlier this year. This led us to further examine the safety policies on this aspect of what we do.

Motts has a very strong safety ethos in place as a company and of course because they are specialists in the school travel area they are best placed to give advice on anything that can be done to minimise risks. They have a useful section on their website that deals specifically with safety for school travel which may be good to refer parents to who require further assurances on the safety of a trip to us by coach.

We also firmly believe that by using drivers who are very experienced in the precise journey to and from MCF along with the excursions that they follow when here, coupled with there being no overnight travel involved on our trips, significantly contributes to the safety of the coach travel associated with a trip to MCF.



Resto Night

In response to feedback from schools about the restaurant night we have been working with Laurent, the manager of Le Relais de Gourmets to try to enhance the French restaurant experience.



Changes include the introduction of Bourgogne gougères to the menu, a selection of
